1. Thank you to Winmar Restoration Specialists for covering all costs for Mathletics for all of our Grade 5-8 students. Mathletics will continue next year for Grade 5-8 students. Michelle Sliva has applied for a grant from the Saskatchewan Math Teachers Society for Mathletics for the 2022-2023 school year and will hear back from them end of May/June? Winmar Restoration Specialists also stated that they will assist us next year as well. Feedback from math teachers about having Mathletics in their classroom has been positive.

6. 2022-2023 Student Fees - For approval (No monetary changes except that one grade 7 teacher has asked for student agendas.

We will be receiving a 1.0 increase in teacher staff (likely only school in division), based on current numbers projected. Our plan is to institute a designated room for stabilizing and increasing our students' learning in the Math and ELA area for grades 5-8, likely in the first 2 periods of the day.

Our scheduling and times will look a little different as we move back to a Semester system but maintained some 2-hour classes for our grade 10-12 classes. Timetabling is almost complete and tentative as we hold steady before finalizing classes and teachers given that the 1.0 teacher addition may scaled back due to the lack of budget money. We have rearranged our RTI schedule based on the need to be more productive with this instructional time. We maintain a 6 day cycle but with only 5 classes/day and RTI will now be a full hour but only 2x/week.

Celebrations: Mixed curling team won Provincial Gold last month and our Sr. Basketball teams lost in regional finals, with the boys only losing by 2 points.

Jr. Boys won silver at District playoffs.

Jr and Sr. Badminton in full swing and have had some success in the first few tournaments.

F n P testing (reading) finished the winter session of evaluation in February and will do a spring session starting in late April through first part of June.

Our SWIS worker is busy with 2 new students with English as a second language. 1 other student from last year as well.

Our counsellor is keeping busy. She has done some remarkable work with our students. Just too many on her caseload.

CCS Garden/Kitchen project has hit a little hiccup, in that the renovation we want to complete, will cost quite a bit more (blame it on inflation).

Graduation is set for June 29th. Plans are for an outside grad at the park with a banquet to follow.
