Canora Composite School Outdoor Recess Policy

<u>Before School</u>: If temperature including windchill is -30 or greater students will come inside immediately at 8:40am in the morning.

NOTE: School doors DO NOT open and students are not supervised until 8:40am.

<u>Inside Recess</u>: If the temperature is -35 or more with the windchill, students will stay inside for recess.

Be Prepared for ALL weather conditions

Because weather is fluid, students should always be prepared for any weather conditions. All students should be prepared to go outside and will be expected to go for fresh air breaks during recess and lunch hour. Administration will determine the length of these breaks based on the inclement weather.

Please ensure that your students are dressed for weather conditions!!
