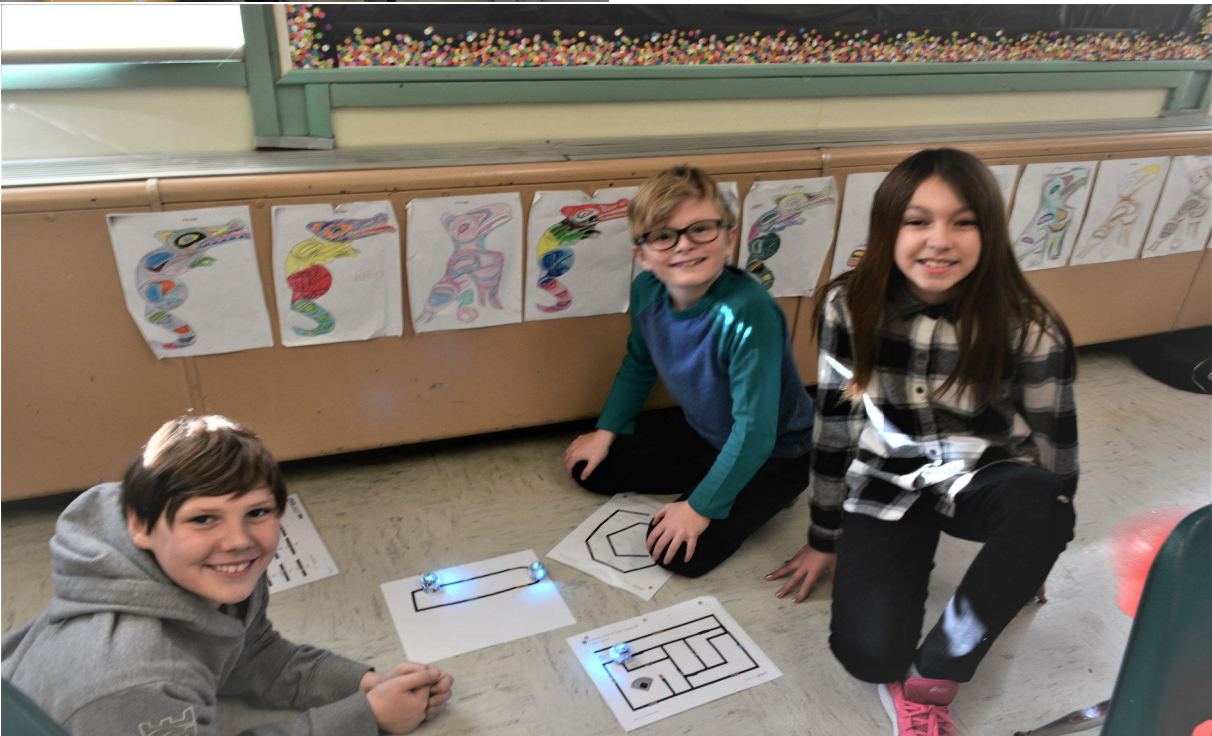
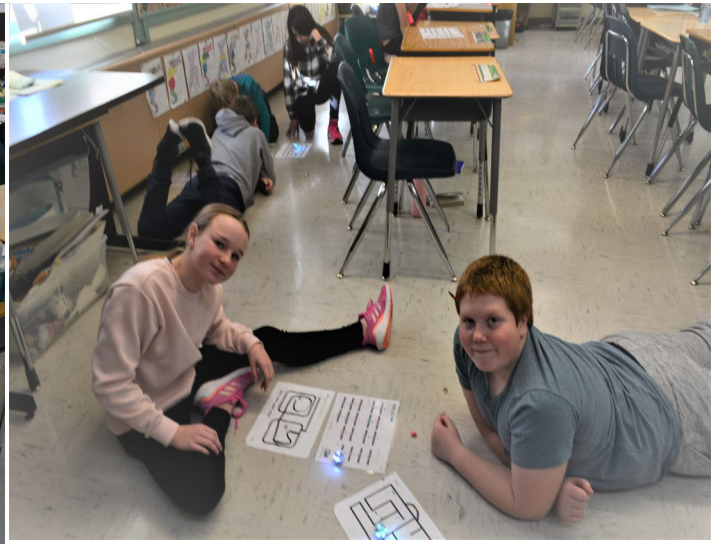


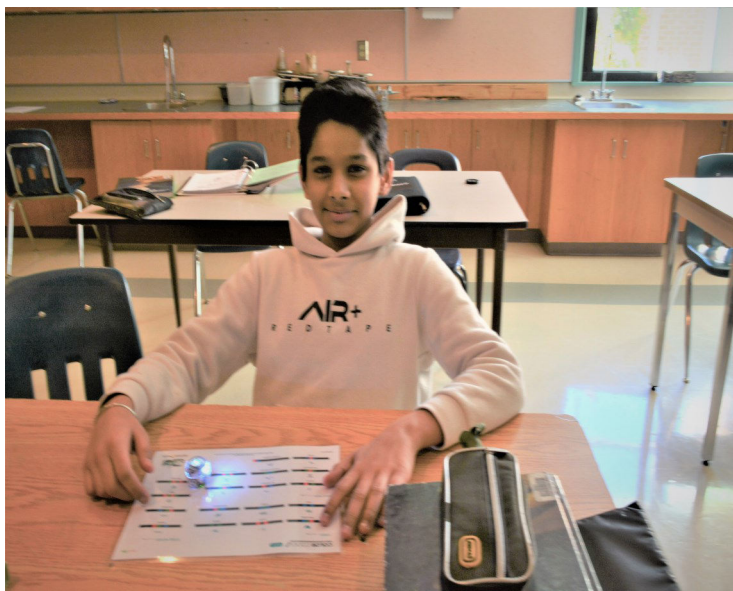
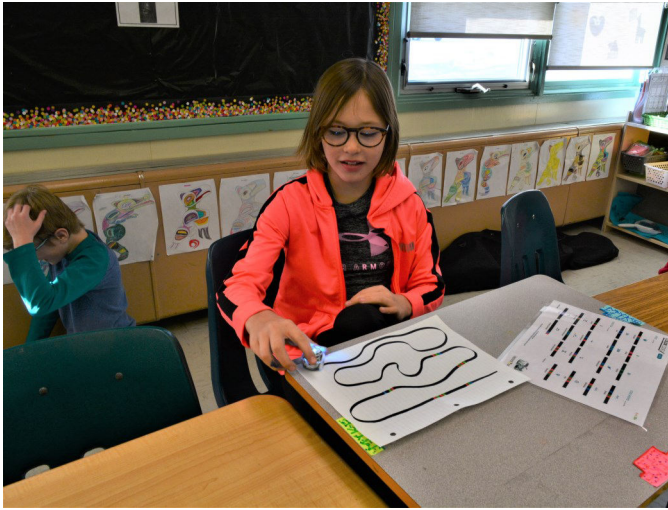
CREATIVE CLASSROOMS
