4. Treasurer's Report Bank balance \$7,669.44 which includes fundraising money of \$4825.00 plus the SLGA grant of \$581.25. 8. Old Business
 - 1) Kitchen –Supper Fundraiser – Derek presented that the blueprints are complete and the tender is open for contractors – to commence asap based on contractor chosen by Division. All appliances have been ordered and are in storage waiting delivery – mostly paid for by current grants. Most small kitchen items have been purchased and receipt to be presented for payment. Engineers agreed an air exchanger is not required – but will be plumbed in – this is saving a lot of money upfront. Kellyanne opened discussion about Supper fundraiser. Will begin planning in fall for an early March supper. We can use the Ukr. Catholic Hall – if we are cooking and take-out cost will be \$75 (member price). If we are hosting in hall the cost will be \$150 (member price). Wednesdays and Fridays are typically open. Tracey will gather a subcommittee to assist with auction items, preparations, planning.

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2) Bank Account – MOTION to open a separate account for FUNDRAISING with signing authority granted to Jill Craig and Kellyanne Ostafie, with both to sign by Kellyanne Ostafie/2nd by Tracey Bletsky, All in Favour, CARRIED. MOTION to transfer fundraising \$ to date to the new account \$5406.25 by Tracey Bletsky/2nd Candace Lowes, All in Favour, CARRIED.

9. New Business

a) 2023/2024 School Fees – All in Favour of keeping the fees the same as previous year.

b) Perogie/Sausage Lunch – the SRC would like to make a perogies and sausage lunch for students using our supply of perogies. Kellyanne will create an order form. \$5 for 2 sausages and 4 perogies. Students can pre-order and we will assist SRC on May 31st to cook and deliver.

c) Awards Night – June 7th – 7:00pm in person – MOTION to sponsor Most Improved Award for each grade (8) up to \$150 by Kellyanne Ostafie/2nd by Candace Lowes, All in Favour, CARRIED

d) John Lang presentation – Derek informed us he has found a presenter that was a student at CCS and is willing to present a cultural and academic based presentation – in May.

e) School Van – Curtis Bailey has discussed with Candace Lowes that there is an opportunity to purchase a second school van. Our committee supports the purchase of a second unit to be purposed and organized in the same manner as current. The van has saved the school budget a lot of money over the years and a second unit will be a huge asset. MOTION of support to purchase school van with due diligence by Candace Lowes/2nd Jill Craig, All in Favour, CARRIED.

4. Our NASP Elementary Team ranked 1st place, Middle School Team ranked 1st place and High School Team ranked 2nd place at NASP Provincials held in Moose Jaw on April 22 & 23. A stellar season!

5. Drop in Basketball with Cst. Bailey Potts with Canora RCMP continues to be a hit with the Grade 5-8 students. More focus will be with the younger students as Grade 9-12 interest has dropped off
6. Provincial Impaired Driving Awareness Week was March 6-10 in Saskatchewan. The CCS SADD Chapter held a poster contest and hosted a sold out SMARTie cookie sale on March 9.
