

John Langan is a Saulteaux/Cree Indigenous man from Keeseekoose First Nation. He once attended Canora Composite School and went on to receive his grade 12 in Prince Albert. A graduate of the Indigenous Justice and Criminology Program at the University of Saskatchewan, an award winning author "A Spark in the Dark", soldier with the Canadian Armed Forces, police officer with the City of Saskatoon, traditional knowledge/language keeper and most importantly a husband and father. John also speaks professionally nationwide to share the beauty of the indigenous culture and ceremony. His story of resilience, unique upbringing, and ability to overcome obstacles in life through perseverance and determination help motivate his audiences.

John graciously donated copies of his book to our CCS library for our students to enjoy!
